



10. All State Governments are directed to utilise in full the entire allocation, so that the allotted funds and food-grains neither lapse nor result in reduction in subsequent allocations. It may be ensured that the above orders are fully carried out and strict revised guidelines are also issued in respect of matters given in point number 7, 8 and 9 above.

**ANTYODYA ANN YOJANA (Order dated 20th April 2004)**

11. Existing condition of possession of a BPL card for inclusion in AAY category must be dispensed with. 12. The process of issue of Antyodya cards to priority groups should be accelerated and the guidelines issued to the state governments must be implemented in letter and spirit.

The above orders should be strictly implemented and revised guidelines in respect of point number 11 mentioned above also issued

**NSAP AND ANNAPURNA (Order dated 27th April 2004)**

13. No scheme covered by the orders of this Court in particular Annapurna and including the National Old Age Pension Scheme, National Family Benefit Scheme, and National Maternity Benefit Scheme shall be discontinued or restricted in any way without the prior approval of this Court. In other words, it means that till further orders, the schemes would continue to operate and benefit all those who were previously covered by these schemes.

14. State Governments should simplify the procedure so that a high proportion of eligible persons are covered under these schemes. These orders must be strictly adhered to

**INTEGRATED CHILD DEVELOPMENT SERVICES (Order dated 29th April 2004)**

15. The norm for supply of nutritious food worth rupee one for every child fixed in the year 1991, to be revised and accordingly increased, to reflect the need to provide a nutritious meal. Kindly consider sending us the revised allocations for the coming financial year so that this order might be implemented in true spirit.

16. All sanctioned AWC's should be made fully operational by 30th June, 2004. The orders should be complied with and revised guidelines issued. It may be noted that the Chief Secretaries of all the states have been directed to file compliance reports on or before 15th September, 2004. This is further to an order dated 29th October, 2002, where it was mentioned that the concerned Chief Secretaries/ Administrators of the States/Union Territories would be held responsible in case of persistent default in compliance of the Orders of the Court.

We request you to take necessary action immediately. We also look forward to a report on the action taken in this matter, so that we might appraise the Court regarding implementation, accordingly.
