Proceedings of the 1st meeting of State level Steering-cum-Monitoring Committee held on 13.4.06 in the 2nd floor Conference Hall of the Secretariat Building.

The 1st meeting of the State level Steering-cum-Monitoring Committee was held on 13.4.06 under the Chairmanship of Shri Ajit Kumar Tripathy, I.A.S., Development Commissioner-cum-Addl. Chief Secretary.

The members present in the meeting is at Annexure-A.

After through deliberation, the following decisions were taken:

1. Under MDM Programme 5156154 number of students studying in 69700 schools have been covered during the year 2005-06. Of these, management of MDM Programme has been handed over to the WSHGs in 7203 schools. Decision was unanimously taken to hand over the rest of the schools to the WSHGs. It was further decided that WSHGs which were managing the MDM management at the school level perfectly and efficiently, those groups would be registered and regulated under Model Bye law to be framed by the W&CD Department.
2. In schools where management work has not been handed over to the WSHGs due to competition among themselves or due to some reasons or the other, it was decided to hand over the management to the WSHG which is represented by more number of mothers of the children than others. It was further decided to supervise the work of the WSHGs, if need be, by the Mothers Committee, the formation of which would be entrusted to the Collectors. Govt. of India guideline on the issue will be examined and separate instructions will be issued to Collectors to involve the mothers with the implementation of Programme as in our State women SHGs are the PIAs (Programme Implementing Agencies).
3. Decision was taken to grow plants like drum-stick(Sajana), Plantation and Papaya in the School Garden. The WSHGs which deal in Pisciculture would be requested to provide fish for the Programme in the days of fish-catching. Further it was decided to facilitate fortification of edible oil used with Vitamin 'A' & 'D'. Similarly, it was decided to request to the Health & Family Welfare Deptt. to make provision for supplying De worming tablets for the children twice a year.
4. It was decided to request P.R. Deptt. to instruct the Gram Panchyats to provide kitchen sheds in the Schools wherever this facility does not exist. About 30% of the schools in the State have separate kitchen shed facility. It was further decided that the State Water & Sanitation Mission will review and ensure provision of safe drinking water source and toilet facilities in the balance uncovered schools. It was reported that 75% of the schools have drinking water facility.
5. The Committee was apprised that 50.02 lakh children will be covered under Mid-Day Meal Programme in the State in the year 2006-07 as per the institution wise detail provided by OPEPA.

The meeting ended with a vote of thanks to the Chair and all the participants.


