Government have been pleased to constitute the Empowered Committee consisting of the following members for scrutinizing and screening the proposals of Voluntary Organizations in respect of project proposals received for the NORAD Programmes by the Mahila Vikas Samabaya Nigam (MVSN) which is the Nodal Agency for this programme.

2. The Empowered Committee shall consist of the following Officers:

3. The Empowered Committee shall appraise the proposals received from the Mahila Vikas Samahaya Nigam (MVSAN) after being scrutinized and pre-appraised. The pre-appraisal by the MVSAN shall include the background and credibility of the organization, its experience in imparting the training programme or running the projects and ascertaining the veracity of the facts and statements submitted by the implementing organization in support of the proposal.

4. The Committee shall work out an Annual Plan for proper and optimum utilisation of the funds earmarked for the State. The Plan of Action shall *inter alia* work out.

- (i) the liability on account of the (a) second instalment of the proposals sanctioned during 2001-2002, (b) continuation of computer programmes sanctioned in the previous years, (c) cases already sanctioned by the DWCD, Government of India during the current year and liability for second installment thereon, and, accordingly, determine the number of fresh cases that can be recommended for the year 2002-2003 within the ceiling fixed for the State;
- (ii) employment potential of various traditional and non-traditional trades in different parts of the State;
- (iii) possibility of opening new areas of training and skill development, specially involving new technologies, which offer good opportunities for employment.
- (iv) the district/region-wise distribution of the programme,
- (v) the extent to which the programme can be implemented in the 'Swayamsiddha' Blocks as per the convergence plan and accordingly earmark allocation for the same.
- (vi) the extent to which Public Sector Undertakings or Corporations such as the State Electronics Corporation or other Organizations such as the Orissa Computer Application Centre can be involved with the programme, particularly; for training in new areas like computer training etc.

5. The Committee shall recommend the cases of only those Non-Governmental Organizations which have a good reputation and a proven track record of integrity, expertise and efficiency and are capable of delivering the programme.

6. The Committee shall ensure that necessary documentation in respect of the project proposals is complete in every respect, as per the check list at Annexure I.

7. The Committee shall give its specific recommendations and forward only those proposals which it recommends for sanctions. The minutes of the Committee's proceedings along with the recommended cases in original shall be forwarded in a bunch to the Department of W. & C. D. Government of India for consideration of the Project Sanctioning Committee (P. S. C.) constituted by the Department of Women and Child Development, Government of India. Individual and isolated cases shall never be recommended.

8. The Committee may recommend twice the number of cases as can be sanctioned within the financial ceiling fixed for the State so as to provide a cushion for possible rejections of some of the proposals by the P. S. C. and also to enable diversion of funds from the State which would not be able to utilise the allocated amount.

9. The approved financial norms of the various traditional and non-traditional trades for training are enclosed at Annexure II. In case the Committee decides to recommend a trade for which no norm has been fixed, the Committee shall suggest such a norm and shall also prescribe a syllabus, a time frame and trainers qualifications for the consideration by the Government of India.

10. The Committee shall meet at least once during a month and try to complete its deliberations by the end of September.

11. The Committee shall adopt its own procedures for meeting.

10. Whether Utilization Certificates in respect of the grants previously received have been submitted?

13. Whether the organisation has been inspected by a functionary of the Government/Corporation/Board and the inspection report is attached?

**SUBJECT**—Change of cadre of Ayurvedic/Unani Distributors and Homoeopathic Assistants to District cadre.

Presently there are 519 sanctioned posts of Ayurvedic Distributors, 9 Unani Distributors and 495 Homoeopathic Assistants for Ayurvedic/Unani Dispensaries and Homeopathic Hospitals/Dispensaries in the State, All these 1,023 posts carry equal scale of pay of Rs. 2,750—4,400/P. M. The nature of duty of the Distributors and Assistants is to assist the Medical Officers in the Dispensaries and to distribute Medicines to the patients at the dispensing counters of the Hospitals/Dispensaries.

2. The above posts come under Group C forming a State cadre. The Director, Indian Medicines and Homoeopathy, Orissa being the appointing authority is controlling their transfer and posting within the State. All though they come under Grade C, their pay scale carry only Rs. 200 and Rs. 1200 (pre-revised) more than that of the Group D, posts having pay scales Rs. 2,550—3,200/— at the minimum and maximum stages respectively. Being low paid employees, the above Distributors and Assistants face insurmountable hardship owing to State level transfer to distant places and come up with representation for cancellation/modification of their transfer or remain on leave to avoid transfer. As a result, work of the Ayurvedic and Homoeopathic Hospitals/Dispensaries is affected adversely.

3. Government after careful consideration have been pleased to convert the State Cadre of Ayurvedic/Unani Distributors and Homoeopathic Assistants into District cadres. The District Cadre shall be fixed on the basis of their option-cum-seniority at the level of D. I. M. H., Orissa. The concerned Ayurvedic/Homoeopathic Inspectors, after fixation of cadre, shall suitably deploy them in the districts earmarked to each employee during the period of annual transfer. Other condition of service in respect of the Ayurvedic/Unani Distributors and Homeopathic Assistants remain unchanged.

4. Transfer from one district cader to another shall be considered and decided by the D.I.M.H., Orissa subject to condition, that the position of the employce seeking a transfer shall be fixed at the junior most position in the district to which he/she goes on tansfer.
