Sabita Das, 12 years old girl child , D/O of Mahendra Das of Kiriburu hill top (Orissa), a domestic child labour rescued by CHILDLINE and her 2 months wage compensation of Rs.1500/- extracted from her employer , a postal employee and a lawyer wife living in Sector -18. The girl handed over to her parent and sent back to her house with warning to her parent to properly look after their girl children.

Rambabu Tanty aged 4 years s/o Krishna Tanty of Bondamunda Sector –D, a daily wage earner whose both retina of eyes were critically infected and was not able to open and see for the last 2 years with high pain. The poor father and the grand mother failed to get any help from the Rourkela Government Hospital. The Lion's eye hospital at Rourkela also failed to cure the child. Then CHILDLINE took the child to SCB Medical College , Cuttack twice but failed and the doctor said the eyes are damaged. At last CHILDLINE, Rourkela took him to the Rotary Eye Hospital At Bidanasi and get him treated there. Now after the treatment of 6 months, the child is able to see the world and 90 % of the vision is recovered.

Suraj Suna, 7 years S/O Nimu Suna , a garbage rickshaw puller of Sector 2 Jhumdi was 80 % burnt cases admitted in the RGH but due to careless treatment and harassment, the poor parent lost all hopes of their child and sought the help of CHILDLINE. We admitted him in the Ispat General Hospital, Rourkela and the with the kind support of the Mr..Om Prakash Agrawal, Director, M&HS, and Dr.Sahoo the child was operated and treated for 2 months free of cost by the IGH due to our appeal and care taken. Now the child is able to walk and getting cured very fast.

Rani Singh aged 12 years, D/O Late Rohtash Singh of Nathupura, Nirankari city, New Delhi came out of the house in search of work to earn livelihood for her ailing mother, 2 brothers and sister. She was kidnapped by miscreant alluring her for good work at Faridabad and taken in a train. The ignorant child when passed one and half day and Faridabad did not reach, the child sensed some problem and ran away from the train when it stopped at Rourkela and caught hold of a railway police personnel who rescued the girl and handed over to CHILDLINE. We after a long search find out her address and repatriated the girl to her house at Delhi and provided ration for one month to her family who were suffering from hunger for last few days

Balishankara 8 years, Jana 6 years and Ajay Bihor 4 years detached from their parent 2 years back while travelling, found by CHILDLINE Kolkata and handed over to CHILDLINE Rourkela, Listening their tribal language and only name Simdega which they can speak. We kept them in our shelter for one and half year and searched their parent in the entire Chottanagpur plateau. At last we found her mother after one and half year from a forest village called karsei in Simdega where primitive tribe people living but unfortunately it was much late. Their father died in grief of his lost sons. Even then the reunion of mother with her three sons and one daughter bring happiness to them and satisfaction to the CHILDLINE

Sushila Singh D/O Sobhanath Singh of Vill: Potabeda, Raja Basa, Block : Lathikata, Dist.Sundergarh. was sold at Delhi by a girls trafficking agency as domestic labour and kept for 3 years without allowing her to come to her house and without giving any remuneration. CHILDLINE, Rourkela with the help of Delhi Police and CHILDLINE, Delhi rescued the girl and claimed her pending wage of Rs.17,000/- which is given to her immediately.

A male child abandoned on the railway track near Rourkela Railway station spotted by a railway gangman and informed the CHILDLINE. We rescued the child and admitted him in RGH , treated him, after recovery kept in the Shanti Bhawan children's home run by Missionary of Charity with the help of CWC.

An infant of a day was thrown in the bush of Sector 14 area , injured by dog bite in his cheek was rescued by CHILDLINE Rourkela admitted in RGH and treated with our support. After recovery, she was handed over to Shanti Bhawan, Rourkela for rehabilitation. She was later adopted by a person in 18 with the help of Child Welfare Committee, Rourkela.
